Minutes Residents' Association 9-7-18

The meeting was called to order at 1:30, and there were 60 in attendance. We then spent 60 seconds of silence to commemorate 9/11/01. Bob Morrill led the pledge of allegiance to both the American and Christian flags. Marlene Batts introduced 5 new residents: Shirley Boss, Margaret Beaver, Ruby Partin, Betsy Roddy, and Patricia Mikle. The minutes from the June meeting were approved as printed in the Trumpet, and the treasurer's report was read with the motion to approve being made by Frank .

Next followed the staff reports:

Carolyn Martin (administrator)

1. The power shortage was due to an infrastructure problem back by the loading dock. A new cable but the old tube was used to fix it. We were told that we should always have a lantern or flashlight available in case of any recurring problems. Also found were defective switches and batteries in the buildings.

2. Café restaurant

- a. We had to add hot water stations.
- b. There has to be a health department inspection.
- c. We must tax prepared food items
- d. Focus group: sign up for Tuesday, Sept. 18 for study group to discuss likes and dislikes of living here.

3. The picnic is Saturday, Sept. 22 and will have a 70's theme.

4. The Open House will be in the evening, Oct. 18. We will need to buy tickets.

5. The Restaurant must serve 30 meals a day to stay in business. We will have omelet days, birthday dinners, and a Candlelight Dinner.

Brian Williams (food)

1. Our events will have no taxing because we are a non-profit.

2. We had a number of problems because of the blackout.

3. The quality of the restaurant is between a little dinner and upscale.

- a. Sunday brunch will be \$10 per person.
- b. We will show a menu whenever possible.
- c. If we wish to tip, we can make a donation to the employee fund.

4. The birthday dinner will include pork chops and BBQ chicken.


