## November 8

Meeting was called to order by President Pete Batts at precisely 1:30. 48 residents attended A new resident was introduced. Welcome Catherine Wright. The pledge to the American and Christian flags were led by Bob Healy and Mariam Woodcock read an inspirational message.

David Miller, VEH Director gave an overview of plans for the Village renovation and expansion. Plans are now being firmed up and will be presented to the state and the township for approval this month. As digging begins for the expansion much renovation will be occurring in the existing buildings. There will be some confusion during the transition and residents and families will be notified of any temporary relocations. *Question:* funding for project partly comes from annual rents. As usual there will be 3% increase this year.

Elaine Walton, secretary read the minutes from the last meeting. They were approved.

Gladys Stolzenfeld, treasurer presented a financial report.
